<b>Bishop Nick</b> , Braintree, Essex <b>LocAle</b>	<b>Oath</b> An American pale brewed with four flavoursome US hops: Centennial, Citra, Comet and Mosaic. Flavours of stone fruits, mango, blueberry and passionfruit.	4.4% <b>Pale Ale</b>
	<b>Divine</b> A festival of English flavours featuring spice, nuttiness and caramel, nicely balanced with a mellow hoppiness.	5.1% <b>Dark Amber Ale</b>
<b>Butcombe</b> , Wrighton, Bristol	<b>Adam Henson's Rare Breed</b> Subtle aromas of unripe fruit with sulphurous hints. Malty flavour is masked by dry bitterness which continues into the finish.	3.8% <b>Pale Ale</b>
<b>Chelmsford Brew Co</b> , Great Baddow, Essex <b>LocAle</b>	<b>Port Jackson</b> Smooth and malty with a hint of chocolate and a light and silky mouthfeel.	4.0% <b>Black Ale</b>
	<b>Death of a Cowboy</b> Heavily hoppy, this is a saloon brawl of fresh hops flying at you. Smooth malts kick in for a balanced finish.	4.7% <b>Golden Ale</b>
<b>Colchester</b> , Wakes Colne, Essex <b>LocAle</b>	<b>Metropolis</b> A superb golden hoppy beer, with enormous depth of flavour and a long spicy finish.	3.9% <b>Golden Ale</b>
	<b>Old King Coel</b> A rich dark porter brewed the original way with brown malt.	5.0% <b>Porter</b>
<b>Crouch Vale</b> , South Woodham Ferrers, Essex <b>LocAle</b>	<b>Brewers Gold</b> Golden pale ale with striking citrus hop alongside biscuity malt supported by a sweet fruitiness.	4.0% <b>Golden Ale</b>
	<b>Yakima Gold</b> Very pale gold, brewed with delicious (and outrageously expensive) US Amarillo hops, which are earthily aromatic, producing a highly drinkable beer.	4.2% <b>Golden Ale</b>
<b>Dartmoor</b> , Princetown, Devon	<b>Jail Ale</b> Stronger session ale with complex notes dominated by malty sweet bitterness. Well-rounded caramel and fruit with a pleasant aftertaste.	4.8% <b>Amber Ale</b>
<b>Dorking</b> , Capel, Surrey	<b>DB One</b> Hoppy best bitter with underlying orange fruit notes. Some balancing malt sweetness in the taste leads to a dry, bitter finish.	4.2% <b>Amber Ale</b>
<b>East London Brewing Co</b> , Leyton, London E10	<b>Nightwatchman</b> A complex beer. Peach, caramelized fruit, toffee balanced by bitter, nutty and roasted malt flavours. Dry aftertaste.	4.5% <b>Ruby Ale</b>
	<b>Quadrant Oatmeal Stout</b> Flavours of creamy chocolate and Christmas cake with an oat dryness, continuing into a long, sweet spiced fruitcake bitterish aftertaste.	5.5% <b>Stout</b>
<b>Elusive</b> , Wokingham, Berkshire	<b>Level Up</b> An American-style red ale with rotating hop varieties. This version is hopped with Simcoe & Citra.	5.0% <b>Red Ale</b>
	<b>Assassin's Trail (in collaboration with Rooster's, Harrogate)</b> A blend of Golden Promise, Munich, Caramalt and Rye malts.	5.9% <b>Golden Ale</b>

<b>Grain,</b> Harleston, Suffolk	<b>Blackwood</b> A smooth and creamy stout, with flavours of chocolate and roasted malts.	4.5% <b>Stout</b>
	<b>Lignum Vitae</b> Orange, toffee and banana on the nose and first taste. A smooth, digestive sweetness adds depth as bitterness slowly grows.	6.5% <b>Dark Amber Ale</b>
<b>Gun,</b> Heathfield, East Sussex	<b>Parabellum Milk Stout</b> A rich jet-black milk stout using barley, oats, wheat and toasted chocolate malts, producing balanced coffee, vanilla and chocolate notes.	4.1% <b>Stout</b>
<b>Hop Back,</b> Salisbury, Wiltshire	<b>GFB</b> A light gold, refreshing bitter. The hoppy aroma leads to bitterness initially, lasting through to the finish with some fruit.	3.5% <b>Golden Ale</b>

	<b>Moonraker</b> A strong, malty, fruity aroma. The flavour is rich and sweet, with roast malt and the finish is fruity yet dry.	6.5% <b>Dark Amber Ale</b>
<b>Keltek,</b> Redruth, Cornwall	<b>King</b> Premium bitter with a mix of malt and hop aromas. Biscuit malt balanced by tropical and citrus hops. European Beer Winner 2022.	5.1% <b>Amber Ale</b>
	<b>Pilot Gig</b> This six-malt dark beer has a subtle liquorice-like sweetness to balance the chocolate notes, as well as a slight hint of saltiness.	5.2% <b>Dark Ale</b>
<b>Kent,</b> Birling, Kent	<b>Prohibition</b> A citrusy pale ale highly hopped with some of the latest American hops.	4.8% <b>Pale Ale</b>

<b>Leigh on Sea,</b> Leigh-on-Sea, Essex 	<b>Moonlit Tides (in collaboration with Howling Hops, Hackney Wick)</b> New England Pale Ale using lots of oats and wheat. A mixture of Sabro, Citra, Motueka and Ekuanot hops gives aromas of grapefruit and strawberries.	4.2% <b>Pale Ale</b>
	<b>LOS Keeper</b> A dark, complex and full-bodied beer based on the London "keeping" stouts of the 1800's. Brewed with 6 different malts and East Kent Golding hops.	8.0% <b>Stout</b>
<b>Mad Squirrel,</b> Hemel Hempstead, Hertfordshire	<b>Tartan Scotch Ale</b> Caramel overtones, with a rich, toasty malt character. A traditional scotch ale.	4.9% <b>Amber Ale</b>

<b>Tiny Rebel,</b> Newport, Gwent (Wales)	<b>Cwtch</b> Champion Beer of Britain in 2015. A balanced ale that combines caramel malt flavours with citrusy hops.	4.6% <b>Red Ale</b>

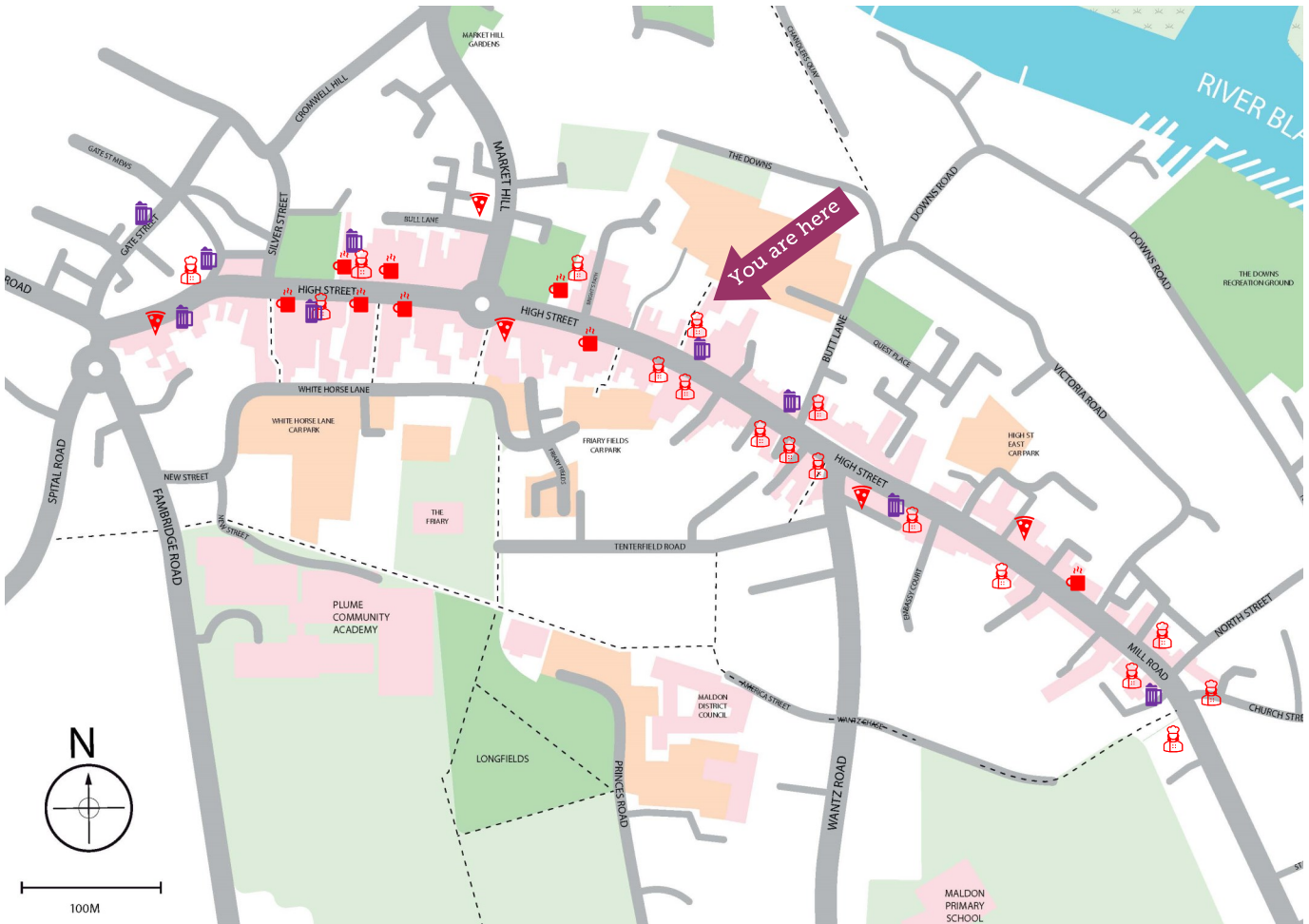
