The dust has finally settled on another Maldon beer festival, the 19th version of our beer and cider festival. Following its return last year in a new venue—the Cygnet Rooms at the Swan Hotel—we saw nearly 1000 visitors coming along over the 4 days. On offer were 48 ales and 12 ciders, and the range of choice met with great approval from our visitors. Nearly 2900 pints were served during the festival, for which this year's chosen charity was the Royal British Legion.

A total of 13 new CAMRA memberships were taken out during the festival, 5 joint memberships and 3 single ones. A warm welcome to all of them and we hope to see them at a social event or festival very soon! Festivals cannot take place without the support and hard work of volunteers. Many of our regulars returned and were joined by a number of "first timers", some of whom only joined CAMRA last year. We were yet again blessed with good weather for the second year running, especially on Friday and Saturday. Many of our visitors were able to sit in the sunshine, very welcome after a rather wet February. Obviously the sun shines on the righteous!
